

Successful CEVI workshop on ISINI conference, 2 September 2022

On September 1 and 2, 2022, the fifteenth ISINI conference was held in Wroclaw, Poland. At this bi-annual conference, CEVI organized a (virtual) workshop on Energy and Valuation Issues, consisting of two sessions this time.

The first presentation was made by *Wietze Lise* and his paper was on the decomposition of CO₂ emissions in Turkey. The second presentation was given by *Sıdıka Başçı* and her co-authored paper was on time-frequency connectedness between green bonds and clean energy markets. The last speaker in the first session was *Mustafa Kaya*, who presented a paper electricity price forecasting using deep learning approaches with an empirical study on Turkish markets.

Robin van Emous held a presentation on a paper about Sector and Country Effects of Carbon Reduction and Firm Performance. The paper presentation by *Nermin Yaşar Başkaraağaç* was on the relationship between ESG and economic growth, using evidence from the Commonwealth of Independent States. Finally, *André Dorsman* provided a perspective on the role of energy service companies (ESCO's).
